## Seven Mercy Hospitals Earn Top Grade From Patient Safety Watchdog Group

## **SOUTH ST. LOUIS COUNTY**



Mercy hospitals each earned an A grade for spring 2024 from The Leapfrog Group, a national nonprofit watchdog group for patient safety. Three of those Mercy hospitals maintained the straight A status by achieving at least five consecutive A grades. Leapfrog assigns letter grades to hospitals across the country based on more than 30 measures of errors, accidents, injuries and infections as well as the systems hospitals have in place to prevent them.

Mercy Ada, Mercy Fort Smith, Mercy Northwest Arkansas, Mercy Oklahoma City, Mercy Springfield, Mercy South (St. Louis) and Mercy Washington each received A grades. Mercy Fort Smith is a straight A hospital with its 16th consecutive A, Mercy NWA maintained a straight A with its 10th straight A, and Mercy South remains a straight A hospital with its 6th A in a row.

Nationally, only 29% of hospitals achieved an A grade from Leapfrog this spring. In Arkansas, Mercy Fort Smith and Mercy NWA are two of only six hospitals to receive an A. In Oklahoma, Mercy Ada and Mercy Oklahoma City are two of only 11 hospitals to achieve an A. In Missouri, Mercy Springfield, Mercy South and Mercy Washington are three of only 14 hospitals to earn an A.



"Patient safety and high-quality care are priorities in everything we do," said Kat Nelson, Mercy chief quality officer. "Have an independent organization like Leapfrog validate that we are providing that high level of care is important. And it reflects the efforts of all our coworkers from clinicians to support staff."

The Leapfrog Hospital Safety Grade is the only hospital ratings program focused exclusively on preventable medical errors, infections and injuries. The Leapfrog grade is peer-reviewed, fully transparent and free to the public. Grades are updated twice annually, in the fall and spring.
