

# Hearts of Mercy



# From the Theological Framework

The New Testament and early Church never imagined salvation in individualistic terms. The new creation of which St Paul speaks connects the Spirit of Christ to as broad a context as possible, the dynamic emergence of the natural world, and places the life of the Church at the heart of it (Romans 8:18-25). That life charges the history of the world with the meaning of the body of Christ, the meaning of mercy.

## Reading

Everything we do in life, the Scripture reminds us, goes into the treasury of the heart. The ideas with which we fill our hearts determine the way we live our lives. Those are the things we draw on in those moments when we need to reach down deep inside ourselves for character, courage, endurance, and hope. That's why what we read, what we see, and what we do from day to day counts so much in life. The heart is not an arrow. It is an amalgam of magnets, all pulling in different directions. It is commitment to family, commitment to self, commitment to success, commitment to life, commitment to God, commitment to security, commitment to approval – all jangled and knotted and demanding. Goodness is the ability to choose one over the other when it counts.

You have commissioned us to work as Christ's hands and feet,


Help us labour for what is right, just and merciful.
