
Mercy Book of Prayers

All: May we find you in this place, Lord.



and listen with integrity.


In times of doubt, grant us faith.

We confess that we shrink from their service and from nurturing peace upon the earth.


Breathe forth your spirit of fortitude and strength.

Courage


Lord God,

The hallowing of your name echo through the universe!


May the way of your justice be followed by all peoples of the world!

All: That all may be one.


And may the God of love, find us rich in mercy and compassion. Amen
