

God's Eternal Mercy





Gathering: Mercy Partners Theological

Framework examines the Psalms which strike a familiar chord as much today as they did at the time of their writing. God's people were waiting to be rescued and still today we see countries, communities and individuals anticipating God's mercy and grace to save them.

From the Theological Framework

Of course, faith does not guarantee our safety in this world. Most people experience times when mercy seems far and distant, when through no fault of their own they feel helpless, as with the Psalmist: "How long Lord? Will you forget me forever?" (Psalm 13). And yet the experience of exile and humiliation gives way to return and exaltation throughout the Old Testament. God rescues God's people from oppression, and this rescuing reveals the identity of God as "gracious and merciful," a God whose "steadfast love endures forever" (Psalm 136). "To repeat continually" notes Pope Francis, that "God's mercy endures forever," as the psalm does, seems to break through the dimensions of space and time, inserting everything into the eternal mystery of love" (*Misericordiae Vultus* 7).

May we seek you in our joyous moments and in the depths of despair.


Help us to always find comfort and consolation through your mercy and grace.
